Emotions flow at site of triple homicide

Crowds gather outside northwest-side home where men in their 20s were found shot; police mum on motive.

DETROIT — As police carried the covered bodies **of** three young **homicide** victims from a northwest side home Monday, an anguished woman turned to a large and silent crowd watching the grisly scene from the street.

"I know you dirty dogs are out here. You animals!" shouted the woman. "I hope you're happy with whatever you got out **of** the house."

Police declined to say what they believe lead to the shooting deaths **of** the men, all in their 20s, inside the home **at** 18508 Prairie St. One was found in the basement and two in the dining room. All three had been shot multiple times.

Although their identities weren't released by police, people flocked to the scene because **of** fears telephoned to each other about the possibility that a loved one was involved. People hugged in the street and tears flowed.

Kandice Allman **of** Detroit said one **of** the victims is her cousin, Ivan, who lived on Wisconsin Street.

She said he was visiting a friend **at** the house where the bodies were found shortly after 10:30 a.m. Monday.

She pleaded for the public's help to find the killers.

"If someone saw anything, please call police," she said. "I don't think anybody can get in any trouble for telling the truth."

Police also towed away two cars, a red Ford Focus parked in the driveway and a green Ford Escort parked **at** a curb in front. The vehicles will be examined for evidence, said Officer Leon Rahmaan, a spokesman for the department.

Jerry Wimberly, who has lived for 15 years in the neighborhood near Livernois Avenue and Seven Mile, said although the area has seen its share **of** problems, the discovery **of** the **triple homicide** is shocking.

"I don't know what it is, but it's usually something where you invited the trouble in," Wimberly said.
