

## **FORCED INTO TRUNK LAST MONTH \ ABDUCTION, SHOOTING VICTIM DIES**

A 19-year-old Detroit woman has died as the result of gunshot wounds she suffered after being abducted and forced into the trunk of a stolen car last month, police said Friday.

Yvette Jones died Thursday at Providence Hospital in Southfield of complications from the wounds. She had been shot several times in the face and chest after being abducted in Detroit and driven to Southfield on Jan. 28.

Warrants were issued Friday for two Detroit men on charges of felony murder and committing a felony with a firearm.

**THE TWO MEN -- Rex Love**, 21, and David Hudson, 25 -- are being held in Detroit on similar charges in another killing. No date has been set for their arraignment in Southfield.

Southfield police responded to a call at Pierce and Mt. Vernon on Jan. 28 after witnesses reported hearing shots and seeing two men run from the back of a car.

Jones told police she had dropped a friend off in northwest Detroit and was driving near McNichols and Greenfield when her car was bumped from behind.

When she stopped, the two men forced her into the trunk of their car -- which had been stolen -- and drove both cars to Southfield. Jones was then shot several times and left for dead. Witnesses called police when they saw her getting out of the trunk screaming for help.

Southfield police determined that the car belonged to a Lewis Wilson of Detroit and notified Detroit police, who contacted Wilson. Police later determined that a woman whose body was found in an alley in the Grand River-Tireman area was Wilson's wife, Ruth.

Love and Hudson were arraigned last week in Detroit District Court on charges of first-degree murder, armed robbery and using a firearm in Wilson's slaying.
