Jury says man is guilty of cop's attempted murder

A jury convicted a Highland Park man Tuesday of attempted murder for shooting an off-duty Detroit police officer three times earlier this year.

Ronnie L. Anderson, 44, faces up to life in prison when he is sentenced Jan. 4 in Macomb County Circuit Court.

The officer, **Carl Mack**, consoled his relatives who broke down after the jury read the verdict.

The jury deliberated for three hours.

Prosecutors alleged that a masked Anderson attacked Mack, 42, in his Macomb Township garage in February, shooting him three times, as he prepared to take his fiancée's two children to school. Anderson had denied being anywhere near Mack's house that day.

Anderson showed no emotion as deputies escorted him to jail, where he was ordered to stay until sentencing.
