Man gets 32 years for shooting an off-duty officer

A Highland Park man will spend at least 32 years in prison for shooting an off-duty Detroit police officer three times at the officer's home in Macomb Township.

Ronnie Anderson, 44, was convicted of attempted murder in the shooting of **Carl Mack**, which happened in Mack's garage last February. Mack was dating Anderson's former girlfriend at the time.

Circuit Judge Mary Chrzanowski granted the prosecution's request to exceed sentencing guidelines, according to Macomb County Assistant Prosecutor William Dailey.

Anderson was sentenced to 30 to 70 years for attempted murder, up to 20 years for home invasion in the case, and an additional mandatory two years for a felony firearm charge. The sentences for the attempted murder and home invasion convictions are concurrent, but the gun charge must be served later.
