

Detroit parolee suspected of shooting 5 nabbed in Georgia

DETROIT -- Georgia authorities have arrested a parolee suspected of shooting five people last week in retaliation for making disparaging remarks about his girlfriend, police said Thursday.

Mark Anthony Webster, 23, absconded from parole the same day as the Aug. 31 shooting in which four people were wounded and one died. He faces charges of murder, attempted murder, felony firearm and being a habitual offender.

Authorities familiar with the case said **Webster** is believed to have opened fire on up to eight people in retaliation for disparaging comments about his girlfriend's appearance.

The shooting happened outside a home on Lesure near Florence Street on Detroit's northwest side Friday afternoon, police have said.

A 24-year-old man was killed.

The shooting occurred just after 5 p.m. outside a red brick two-story home as children played outside.

The victims ranged in age from 15 to 28 years old.

Police have said the gunman got out of a vehicle and started shooting his targets.

Webster has a history of drug and firearms crimes, according to the Michigan Department of Corrections.
