

MURDER SUSPECT IS FREED ON BOND

A 34-year-old Detroit man, wanted for five months **on a murder** warrant, **is** free pending a court appearance Friday after paying \$7,500 **on a \$75,000 bond** .

Ronald Green **is** charged with murdering a Detroit man in July, eight months after his release from Jackson Prison **on another murder** conviction.

Green and Carver Tyson, 38, were arrested Sunday night in Lafayette Park near downtown Detroit and charged with felonious assault against police officers who stopped their van.

The officers said they confiscated two 12-gauge shotguns, an automatic AK47 (a Soviet-designed military assault rifle equivalent to the U.S. M16), a .38 caliber revolver and a .45 caliber automatic from the van. The guns were loaded, according to police reports. Police said Green tried to run them down with the van.

GREEN WAS RELEASED after arraignment in Detroit District Court **on** Monday. "I just hope (Green) shows up Friday and I hope he doesn't hurt anybody before then," said Lt. Al Brooks, who supervises the officers handling the latest **murder** case against Green.

Magistrate Vesta Svenson, who set Green's **bond** at \$65,000 **on the murder** charge and \$10,000 **on the felonious assault** charge, stood by her decision Tuesday.

"I have a legal obligation to consider him innocent until he **is** proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt," she said. "He appeared in court with his family and an attorney. Under the circumstances, I think a \$75,000 **bond** , requiring \$7,500 cash, **is** not an unreasonably low **bond** .

Green **is** charged with murdering Stanley Oglesby, 33, **on** July 18.

Tyson also was arraigned Monday. Svenson set his **bond** at \$10,000 **on the charge of felonious assault** against a police officer. Tyson was **freed** after paying \$1,000 **on the bond** .

Green's attorney, W. Otis Culpepper, could not be reached for comment Tuesday.

Officers Frank Shannon and Bruce Thompson of the 7th (Mack) Precinct were in plain clothes when they tried to arrest Green and Tyson at DuCharme Place and Orleans just north of Larned, Svenson said.

In the next few minutes, Green and Tyson aimed handguns at the officers and repeatedly tried to run the officers down with the van, according to a police report.

The officers cornered the pair when Green drove the van into a parking lot from which there was no exit, they said.
