

Parents charged in tot's death - Prosecutor says dad left girl with mom who can't have contact with her.

DETROIT -- Less than two months after a 2-year-old girl was treated at Children's Hospital for burns on her inner thighs and ankle, the toddler was taken back to the hospital Nov. 3, where she was pronounced dead with skull fractures, a broken clavicle and other injuries.

On Tuesday, Wayne County Prosecutor Kym L. Worthy charged the baby's father, Warren **Williams**, 40, with involuntary manslaughter for leaving **Carila Williams** alone with her mother, Nicole Holloway, the morning the baby died. Holloway was under a court order not to have contact with her child because of prior abusive conduct.

Holloway's parental rights had been terminated by the state shortly after **Carila** was born because of an extensive history of neglect and drug abuse, Worthy said. She was charged with murder this month in connection with **Carila's** death on Nov 3.

Worthy said the prosecutor's office learned about the first incident of suspected abuse after her office began investigating the child's death. She said the state's Children's Protective Services was still investigating the first incident at the time of the death.

She refused to comment on whether **Carila's** death could have been prevented after the incident with the burns came to light in September.

"I am going to wait until (Protective Services) finish their investigation," she said. Maureen Sorbet, spokeswoman for Protective Services, said child privacy restrictions prevent her from commenting.

Holloway is in the Wayne County Jail awaiting a competency evaluation.
