

## **Police catch suspect wanted in 2 homicides**

DETROIT -- A man named on the Detroit Police Department's first Most Violent Persons list was arrested Tuesday night after a shootout with officers.

**Vincent Calhoun**, 44, was shot at least twice and was struck in the head and chest, said Detroit Police Second Deputy Chief James Tate.

**Calhoun** was taken to Sinai-Grace Hospital in Detroit where he was listed in critical condition last night. Today there was no record of him being at the hospital, a spokeswoman said.

He could be arraigned today. Tate was not sure of his location after leaving the hospital.

"It was vital that we got this person into custody," Tate said.

Investigators have been looking for **Calhoun** since 2004. He is a suspect in a homicide in 2004 and 2006, Tate said. He was put on the Most Violent Person list in 2004. The department Web site states that **Calhoun** shot three people in 2004 and one of them died.

A tip about 7 p.m. Tuesday led police to **Calhoun**, who was in an apartment near Evergreen and Schoolcraft roads.

**Calhoun** shot one officer, but the man's bullet-resistant vest stopped the slug, Tate said. The officer was not injured. He was taken to an area hospital for observation.

The Special Response Team was called because the situation had become a barricaded gunman scenario, Tate said.

When the team attempted to get into the apartment where **Calhoun** was at, he came out and pointed a gun at officers, who shot him, Tate said. "The unit took him down," Tate said.

Tate said the tip was important in nabbing **Calhoun**. Tate did not have information about the homicides for which **Calhoun** is a suspect. He said catching people like **Calhoun** takes the police and the community.

"It takes the community to bring us tips to bring these individuals to justice," Tate said. "When we have someone this dangerous, we need the community's help in apprehending him."
