

## **Suspect in fatal shooting turns himself in**

A man wanted in the shooting death of a Taylor woman Sept. 21 has turned himself into Detroit police.

**Jeremy Rice** , 24, surrendered to police early Saturday, according to a report on WDIV-TV (Channel 4). Police say Rice shot Amanda Brown, 23, in the head as she sat in a truck parked in front of the Henry Ford Health System clinic in Hamtramck.

Police say after Rice shot Brown, he pushed her out of her truck and fled in the vehicle, which was later recovered. Brown lingered for two days after the shooting before she was declared brain dead and was removed from life support. Rice has been arraigned on charges of first degree murder, carjacking, possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony and being a felon in possession of a firearm.

If convicted of murder Rice -- who was on parole for auto theft -- would face a mandatory sentence of life in prison without chance of parole.
