

SUSPECTED HEROIN WAREHOUSE RAIDED

Detroit police arrested two adults and seized 2,200 packets of **suspected heroin** during a raid Wednesday on a west side home believed to be a major distribution point for the Young Boys Inc. **heroin** ring.

Officer Delbert Jennings of the police narcotics section said nine officers **raided** the home at 3736 Monterrey at 9:30 a.m. and took a 22-year-old man and a 28-year-old woman into custody.

Jennings refused to identify them until their arraignment, scheduled in 36th (Detroit) District Court today.

Jennings estimated the street value of the **suspected heroin** at \$38,000. He said the packets seized were stamped "Raw Dog," "P-Funk" and "CBS" -- all expressions commonly used by Young Boys members to describe types of **heroin** .

Police sources describe Young Boys as a well-organized ring that uses pre-teens as drug runners and maintains a fleet of expensive cars to distribute **heroin** . Police believe the operation nets about \$400,000 a week.

The ring reportedly uses pre-teens as its runners because the children, if arrested, are not likely to be prosecuted or imprisoned.

The alleged distribution center, which reportedly handled \$250,000 a week in street sales, supplied the Dexter-Richton area, Jennings said.

"We got (Wednesday morning) what we figure was the morning supply," Jennings said.

Young Boys has received a great deal of attention after the March 29 slaying of Officer William Green. Police sources said the 17-year-old accused of the slaying may be a member of the group.
