

## TRIO TO FACE TRIAL IN SLAYINGS OF FOUR

Three men were ordered Tuesday **to stand trial in** the submachine-gun **slaying of four** people -- including a 12-year-old boy -- and the wounding **of** another man during an August robbery **of** an east side "weed house."

Charged with **four** murders, assault with intent **to** murder, armed robbery and using a firearm **in** a felony were Charles Wilson, 20, and Darnell Wiley **of** Detroit. Derrick Dupree, 28, was charged with armed robbery and supplying the machine guns used **in** the attack, though he did not take part **in** the incident.

Edward Allen, an admitted member **of** the raiding party, testified against the three Tuesday **in** Detroit District Court under a grant **of** immunity. Allen, 17, an escapee from the state's Maxey Boys Training School **in** Whitmore Lake, said he told on his friends **to** help himself, although he had shared **in** the drugs taken from the weed house.

"If I hadn't got any I would have told," he said. "Yes, I told anyway."

A **FOURTH** man, Anthony Goodman, 23, is being sought on murder and assault charges **in** connection with the incident.

Killed during the robbery **of** the weed house on the 2200 block **of** Hart Street were Charles (Rusty) Hampton, and his wife, Pamela, both 21; Charlie Grace, 33, and Herman Robinson, 12. All the victims died **of** gunshot wounds, according **to** autopsy reports. The boy was shot the most -- seven times **in** the head and the torso -- and all **of** his wounds were potentially fatal.

Lawrence Heath, the 17-year-old nephew **of** the Hamptons, survived gunshot wounds **in** the back and a leg. The Hamptons' 11-month-old daughter was spared.

Heath testified that he was asleep on a living room sofa through most **of** the attack and could not identify any **of** the gunmen.

Allen testified that he met with Wilson, Wiley and Goodman at Goodman's house and planned the robbery. **To** make sure money and drugs were at the weed house, Goodman and his aunt went **to** the Hart Street flat and made a purchase, Allen said.

The **four** then drove **to** Dupree's Southfield home, where Dupree displayed **four** Thompson submachine guns and told Wilson which two **to** use, Allen said. Claiming that he was unarmed, Allen said, Wilson and Wiley took the submachine guns while Goodman chose a .32-caliber pistol for the attack.

**ALLEN SAID** the robbery went off as planned: He and Goodman rang the doorbell and Wilson and Wiley rushed Hampton when he opened the door. Allen said he ran back **to** the car as the

other three forced Hampton up the stairs at gunpoint.

Fifteen minutes later, Allen said, he heard "a lot **of** gunshots." Then Goodman ran **to** the car as more shots rang out. Allen said the other two ran **to** the car within a few minutes.

Allen said they drove **to** the home **of** Wilson's girlfriend, where they divided the marijuana -- cutting out a share for Dupree -- the money and guns. Later, the men went **to** a group **of** houses on St. Patrick, which they fired into because someone who lived **in** one **of** them had allegedly robbed Wilson's girlfriend, Allen said.
