COP SHOOTING SUSPECT IS DEAD - HE LIKELY KILLED HIMSELF AFTER STANDOFF

A man suspected of **shooting** a Detroit police narcotics officer was found **dead** Saturday inside a Clinton Township apartment from an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head.

Police said Chauncey Wallace, 22, of Detroit had been holed up in the apartment since 11:30 p.m. Friday. He barricaded himself with weapons after he carjacked a man in Detroit and fled to the Macomb County suburb, police said.

Clinton Township crisis negotiators spent several hours overnight attempting to convince Wallace to surrender, but he refused, even firing shots at officers. After losing contact with him, police heard more gunshots coming from the apartment about 10 a.m. Saturday, said Clinton Township Officer Joseph Fix.

Robotic cameras from the Michigan State Police were used to determine that Wallace was lying on the floor. Officers entered the apartment and found him **dead**. Residents of the Glenwood Apartments at 15 Mile and Harper were evacuated during the standoff.

The Detroit officer was shot about 5:30 p.m. Friday during a traffic stop in the 4200 block of Richton on the city's northwest side. He was shot in the right wrist and shoulder; his injuries are not life-threatening.
