Mourners honor woman found dead in car

REDFORD TOWNSHIP -- Nearly 100 people attended a candlelight vigil Wednesday night for 26-year-old Daniella Munoz, whose body was **found in** the trunk of a **car** at A&H Express Lube Inc. on Monday.

Three pictures of Munoz, who was from Detroit, were taped to the window of the oil change shop on Plymouth Road near Columbia Street. Teddy bears, floral arrangements and a red novena candle were placed around the window by friends and family.

"She was loved, as you can see," said Munoz's brother, Ruben Castillo, who wore a white T-shirt with pictures of his sister on it.

Munoz's boyfriend, whom she had been seeing for the past year, is a suspect **in** her death. She was **found in** the trunk of a black Chevy Caprice that he had been driving.

Police believe the man, **in** his 20s, fled to Beirut, Lebanon. Redford Township Police Chief John Buck said his office is still awaiting the approval of an arrest warrant. The department has sought assistance from the FBI office **in** Detroit.

Munoz's mother, Teresa, said her daughter was **in** an abusive relationship and that she begged her daughter to leave the man.

"Every day she left home I would feel something (would) happen," she said. "My feeling is he has no heart, no feelings and no conscience."

"I will not rest until he comes back to this country," she said.
