HAYWARD BROWN CASE \ FBI TO CONDUCT TESTS ON FATAL BULLET

The **bullet** that killed Hayward Brown will be sent **to** the **FBI** for firearms identification **tests**, the investigator in charge of the case said Friday.

Brown, 30, a suspect in six police shootings 12 years ago when he was the object of one of the most intensive searches in Detroit's history, was killed Wednesday in what police believe was a robbery attempt involving drugs.

The apparent robbery victim, John Harris, 52, was shot in the chest and is in serious condition. Police found suspected narcotics **on** Harris.

Police are seeking three men believed **to** have taken part with Brown in the apparent robbery attempt.

"IT SEEMS CLEAR that they were trying **to** rob Harris, but he surprised the robbers," said Sgt. Chalmers Sanders, in charge of investigating the case.

Sanders said Harris "looks like an old man, but he must have had a little more spunk than they thought. The old man was a little too bad for them."

Brown was shot in the forehead and suffered what police called a superficial wound of the neck. The **bullet** removed from his head will be sent **to** the **FBI**, Sanders said. The other **bullet** was not recovered.

Sanders said four people were seen driving up **to** the apartment house at Holbrook and Brush where Harris had been staying. He said Harris let Brown and one other man into the apartment. Another man is believed **to** have gone onto the third floor, and the fourth remained in the brown Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Sanders said.

Brown's notoriety stemmed from two police shoot-outs in December 1972 that left five policemen wounded and one dead. Two other men sought in the house- **to** -house search, John Boyd Jr. and Mark Bethune, fled **to** Atlanta, where both died in shoot-outs with policemen.

Brown's funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. today at the Barksdale Funeral Home, 1120 E. State Fair, with burial at Gethsemane Cemetery. Chokwe Lumumba, a leader in the Republic of New Africa, will speak.
