MAN TO GO TO TRIAL IN WIFE'S SLAYING 19 YEARS AGO

Nineteen **years ago**, Thomas Randolph took his wife out for a Chinese dinner. It was her last meal.

A mugger, Randolph later told police, attacked the couple -- striking Randolph **in** the head and fatally shooting Sharron Randolph -- as they sat **in** the family car **in** the Harvard Row shopping center **in** Southfield.

But on Thursday, Oakland County prosecutors are expected **to** present jurors with an entirely different story when Randolph, a Detroit lawyer, goes on **trial** for murder. His jury was seated Monday **in** Oakland County Circuit Court.

Prosecutors plan **to** show that Randolph hired a Mississippi drifter, Sanirell Shannon, then 23, **to** kill his wife. Randolph, then a social worker and teacher, was badly **in** debt and had his eye on his **wife's** \$248,0000 life insurance policy, authorities say.

At the time of the **slaying**, police were suspicious of Randolph but were unable **to** establish a case. But last **year**, investigators **got** two breaks.

During routine task-force investigations, police reinterviewed a witness who admitted he saw the shooting. He also said that some days later he saw Randolph argue with and then pay Shannon.

Also, Shannon's niece told police last **year** that her uncle bragged about the killing, and had come home the night of the shooting spattered with blood.

Using the new information, authorities charged Randolph and Shannon with first-degree murder. If convicted, each **man** faces a mandatory sentence of life **in** prison without parole.

Both **men** will stand **trial** at the same time, but their cases will be heard by separate juries. The selection of Shannon's jury is expected **to** be completed today.

Defense attorneys say the witnesses are lying, and that Randolph was telling the truth about the mugger.

Randolph's role as murder defendant is a head-spinning transformation that moved him from a comfortable home **in** Detroit's exclusive Palmer Woods **to** a cell at the Oakland County Jail.

Within months of the **slaying**, Randolph remarried. His wife, Marie Jackson Randolph, served on the Detroit School Board from 1984 **to** 1989, and then opened a string of day-care centers.

Randolph finished law school, passed the bar and built a successful practice. Together, they hosted lavish parties.

But the good times unraveled in 2000.

Marie Jackson Randolph was convicted of 63 counts of fraud and money laundering. Federal officials said she pocketed federal money earmarked for children **in** her day-care centers. She is now serving a 9- **year** federal sentence.

A few months later, Thomas Randolph was charged with murder.
