## JUDGE LIKELY TO DISMISS NAPIER CASE

Recorder's Court **Judge** Warfield Moore Jr. said Friday that he was inclined **to dismiss** a first-degree murder **case** pending against alleged Young Boys Inc. enforcer Kurt (Kurt McGurk) **Napier**.

"I'm sort of saying what I'm going **to** do without hearing your motion. . . . I just don't think the people's time and money should be used **to** try that **case**," Moore said, telling defense attorney W. Otis Culpepper **to** submit a written brief seeking dismissal of murder and firearms charges.

"I don't think it ought to be tried, and I'm going to give him time to file his motion," Moore said.

FOUR WEEKS ago, a jury deadlocked at 11-1 in favor of acquitting **Napier**, 20, in the May 12, 1983, fatal shooting of Joseph (Wamp) Brown, a small-time drug dealer. In December, another jury found Maurice (Mohawk) Gibbs not guilty of Brown's slaying.

"If this **case** is brought again, it would be the third time this has been tried with the same facts," Moore said. "... So far, 23 people -- 23 citizens -- have said the prosecution's **case** doesn't have enough evidence."

Moore said that the **case** has been pending for almost a year and that **Napier** "has a right **to** get it over with."

When assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Paul Bruno said the **judge** 's comments sounded as though he was "pre-disposed," Moore answered: "Yeah, I am. I've told you I'm pre-disposed . . . because I've sat and listened **to** the evidence, the arguments and know the history of this **case** ."

THE **CASE** against **Napier** is based on Brown's alleged dying statement. A police officer testified that Brown, before dying, said he had been shot by "Mohawk and McGurk -- Kurt McGurk."

This is the second time Moore has threatened **to dismiss** a major felony **case** against **Napier**, who has been labeled "Public Enemy No. 1" by the Prosecutor's Office.

In June, Moore nearly dismissed a **case** in which **Napier** was charged with assault with intent **to** murder for a shotgun attack on a Detroit police sergeant. A jury acquitted **Napier** of that charge in July.

Even if the murder charge is dismissed, **Napier** faces another charge of assault with intent **to** murder for wounding Gregory Kendricks the same day Brown was shot.

Police believe the Brown and Kendricks shootings were part of efforts by members of Young Boys Inc. to settle grudges before entering prison.

**Napier** and more than 40 other members of the heroin ring, and their associates, were indicted on drug-related charges by a federal grand jury in 1982. In June 1983, **Napier**, who pleaded guilty **to** a single count, was declared a fugitive when he failed **to** surrender **to** begin his 32-month sentence.
