Three more arrested in AK-47 bank robberies

DETROIT -- The FBI today **arrested three more** men suspected to be part of the so-called AK-47 Gang responsible for robbing at least seven banks in Metro Detroit and Toledo.

Terez Deon Rivers, Frederick Samuel Humes Jr. and Jawan Martin, were **arrested** after federal agents executed a search warrant of a home on Burlingame, according to a federal affidavit filed today by an FBI special agent in U.S. District Court in Detroit.

They join Andre Jones, and his wife, Sparkle Jones, in federal custody in connection with the robberies. They are accused of using an AK-47 in the bank robberies.

Authorities got a break in the case when Andre Jones was **arrested** Tuesday at a home where authorities allege he was hiding after shooting a Detroit police officer in the elbow. Jones had been shot several times in an exchange of gunfire with two Detroit officers who stopped to check on an SUV parked on the Southfield Freeway near the home in which he was **arrested**, police said.

Cellular phones seized during the arrest led to police watching the home on Burlingame, according to the affidavit. During surveillance, FBI agents saw a van that matched the description of one used in the robberies. An SUV that matched the description of one used in a Toledo bank robbery also was seen at the home.

The agents entered the home and **arrested** Rivers, Humes, and Martin.
