FAKE COP ROBS DETROIT WOMAN AT GUNPOINT

After a police impersonator made his way into a west side **woman** 's home and robbed her **at gunpoint**, the Detroit Police Department is advising residents to be wary if an officer comes to their home.

Before opening the door, ask to see photo identification and get a badge number. Then, residents could call a neighbor to look outside to make sure the person is actually driving a police car. Or residents can verify that the visit is legitimate by calling in the badge number to the nearest district office: Northwest District at 313-596-5600; Southwest District at 313-596-5300; Western District at 313-596-1200; Eastern District at 313-596-5900; Northeast District at 313-596-1100, or Central District at 313-596-1300.

Tuesday's police impersonator knocked on the **woman** 's door in the 13500 block of Birwood, near I-96 and Grand River, **at** 1:30 p.m., police said. The man, described as in his 30s, about 6 foot 1 inch tall and 230 pounds with a muscular build and a black and gray mustache, claimed he and his partner had arrested a man trying to steal her car. Holding an envelope, he asked to come in to show her a picture of the suspect. But then he pulled out a gun and robbed her of cash once she allowed him in her home.

The man had what appeared to be a police badge on a chain hanging around his neck and was wearing all black clothing, police said.
