Second drug ring leader pleads guilty in Detroit

DETROIT -- The second of two brothers who headed a nationwide cocaine ring called the **Black Mafia** Family pleaded **guilty** today **in** federal court **in** Detroit.

Terry Lee Flenory, 37, a Detroit native who was a Los Angeles resident when a federal grand jury indicted him **in** 2005, pleaded **guilty** to leading a continuing criminal enterprise.

He could face 30 years **in** prison when U.S. District Judge Avern Cohn sentences him early next year.

On Monday, Flenory's brother, Demetrius Flenory, 39, a Detroit native who had moved to Atlanta, pleaded **guilty** before Cohn to the same charge.

Together, the brothers, along with others convicted **in** the **case**, are responsible for repaying \$270 million **in drug** profits.

Officials are collecting some of that money by selling off homes, cars, jewelry and other valuables purchased with **drug** proceeds.

Of 41 people charged in the case, 33 have now pleaded guilty.
