

SUSPECT IN 2 KILLINGS TO BE TRIED

An alleged member of the A-Team -- the enforcement arm of one Young Boys Inc. faction -- was ordered Tuesday **to** stand trial for two 1984 killings, including the machine-gun **slaying** of a onetime close associate of slain gang leader Raymond Peoples.

Farod Mallory, 19, of Lathrup Village, is charged with first-degree murder **in** the July 1984 killing of Carl Garrett, 18, at W. McNichols and Schaefer. Garrett, riding a motor scooter, was hit with machine-gun fire from a gunman leaning from a pursuing car, testified Detroit Police Officer Frederick Riley, who saw the shooting while off duty.

Riley said Garrett was hit, fell off his scooter and **tried to** run away, but that the gunman, whom he identified as Mallory, ran up and fired again.

Riley said he started **to** chase Mallory's car, but that a police car took over the pursuit.

According **to** authorities, Garrett was a close friend and sometimes bodyguard **to** Peoples, who authorities say was co- founder of the Young Boys heroin trafficking ring. Peoples was shot **to** death Aug. 10.

In a separate case, Mallory -- associate of alleged A-Team member Dennis Franklin, who was critically wounded **in** a shooting Monday night while awaiting trial on murder charges -- is charged with second-degree murder. That case involves the April 30, 1984, shooting of Jerry (J.R.) Kenny outside a party store at Richton and Dexter.

Nicholas Scott testified Tuesday **in** Recorder's Court that Mallory told him he killed Kenny, 33.

"He said he had on a hat and wig and he shot him. . . . Farod shot J.R.," Scott said.
