

DEADLY STREET RACE DRIVER IN FAIR CONDITION

The Detroit man whose street race crash police say killed a 52-year-old Detroit educator was upgraded to fair condition today, according to hospital officials.

Troy McCrary, 40, is still being treated at Detroit Receiving Hospital for burns and injuries he sustained in the race Thursday, hospital spokeswoman Norine Howie said.

Killed was Delthea Bryson, 55, who ran the computer lab and after-care programs at Burton International School on the city's near westside. Police said **McCrary** crashed his 2005 Mustang GT in a quarter-mile drag race along an industrial area on Dequindre near Canfield. The car carrying Bryson and her adult daughter, Kristyn, flipped after **McCrary** clipped it during the race, police said. Kristyn Bryson suffered minor injuries.

Police identified the driver of a Chevrolet Suburban which transported **McCrary** to Detroit Receiving Hospital after friends pulled him from the burning wreckage of his car, Detroit Police spokeswoman Yvette Walker said Tuesday. The driver has not been charged with a crime, and police were still trying to find the other car involved in the race, she said.
