

Two arrested in Macomb after high-speed chase - C & G Staff Writer

MACOMB TOWNSHIP - After a high-speed chase through Macomb Township Sept. 10, Macomb County Sheriff's deputies apprehended two men involved in a carjacking in Detroit earlier that morning.

Detroit resident **Douglas Brigham**, 17, and Kywan Clemos, 17, of Macomb Township were arraigned and charged with the incident in 41-A District Court in Shelby Township the next day.

Brigham was charged with one count of stolen property, a five-year felony; one count of fleeing and eluding in the third degree, another five year felony; and one count of carrying a concealed weapon, a five-year felony.

His bond was set at \$10,000. Clemos was charged with one count of carrying a concealed weapon and posted a bond of \$5,000.

Detroit police are handling the carjacking charges.

Macomb County Sheriff Mark Hackel said that earlier that morning it was reported that an unknown black male approached a man leaving a CVS drugstore, pointed a gun at him and took off with another suspect in the victim's newer model Buick, which was equipped with an On Star system.

Around 10:20 a.m., the Macomb County Sheriff's Office dispatch received a call from an OnStar operator stating that the system had located the stolen vehicle in the 22 Mile and Romeo Plank area.

Shortly after the call came in, Hackel said, deputies spotted the vehicle in the parking lot of a 7-Eleven gas station.

"The car was stationary at a 7-Eleven on 22 (Mile) and Romeo Plank," he said. "When (the suspects) came out, we weren't sure what they were up to."

Upon noticing the police units approaching, the two men jumped back into the Buick and "took off at a high rate of speed" heading westbound on 22 Mile with a number of patrol cars in pursuit, Hackel added.

As the suspects made a turn into a subdivision near Tilch, an officer was able to strike the side of the Buick, pushing it up onto the curb and pinning it against the neighborhood's brick entrance sign.

Hackel said the officers held the men at gunpoint momentarily, and they gave up without resisting.

"In the center counsel, in plain view, was the handgun used in the original carjacking," he added.

Deputies also recovered two walkie-talkies and a backpack filled with hooded sweatshirts and bandanas, none of which belonged to the vehicle's owner.
