

## 2 DRUG RAIDS NET BIG HAUL

About \$3 million worth of cocaine and heroin was seized during drug raids on two Detroit homes Tuesday, police said.

Police said warrants are to be sought today against 10 people who were arrested -- including one juvenile.

Lt. Warren Harris, of the Police Department's narcotics section, said four of the 10 could face mandatory life sentences because more than 650 grams of each drug was involved.

Also confiscated were \$200,000 in stolen property, including furs and jewelry; a Jaguar, a Mercedes, a Cadillac and a Ford Bronco; \$5,000 in cash, and four guns, including an Uzi-type submachine gun, police said.

Police said that \$35,000 in cash and about \$200,000 in jewelry were seized from a safe-deposit box at the Comerica Bank at 3750 Woodward.

Police said that at about noon they raided a home in the 7800 block of Poe, near Henry Ford Hospital, which they said "was supplying drugs for the whole **Brewster Projects**," a low-income housing complex about a mile from police headquarters near downtown.

At about 3 p.m., they raided a home in the 6000 block of Barrett, which police said was "a major distribution point for the east side."

Police said that the arrest of two suspects at Mack and Chrysler at about 9:15 a.m. Tuesday led to the raid on Poe. They said they followed a 37-year-old suspect from that address to the **Brewster Projects**, where they said he was delivering "at least 400 packs" -- about \$12,000 worth -- of cocaine.
