### **TWO KILLED, ONE SHOT IN DETROIT GANG WAR**

#### **Machine Gun Fire Riddles At- tempted Rescuers of Kid- napped Gangsters.**

DETROIT, March 29 (AP) —The fate of a kidnapped gangster, the police believe, holds a possible solution of the slaying by machine-gun fire of two men and the wounding of a third in the latest outbreak of Detroit's bootleg gang war today.

Entering a third-story apartment hall before daybreak in answer to a tele-

phone summons, Joseph Bloom, George Cohen and Frank Wright, alias "Edward O'Brien," were shot down from behind a steel fire door by a volley of machine gun and revolver bullets. The bodies of Bloom and Cohen were riddled. Wright is in a critical condition at a hospital. Wright, also known as "Frank Burke," is a former convict and is said to be wanted in Chicago in connection with a \$100,000 diamond robbery.

Police were unable to locate Meyer "Fish" Bloomfield, who, they said, was kidnapped Saturday night with his brother-in-law, Albert Albright, and driven out of town. It was in answer to a call to rescue Bloomfield, Wright said, that he, Bloom and Cohen entered the apartment house.
